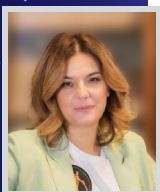

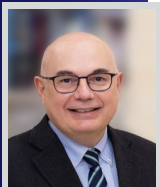

Oncology Unit, Department of Precision Medicine, Università degli Studi della Campania L. Vanvitelli, Naples, Italy

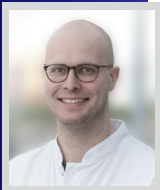
